Hello friends,



May is Family Month. I thought it might be meaningful to think about family devotion. May I assume that we all do devotion at a personally right time of the day? We need to maintain a beautiful relationship with the Lord with all our hearts because it is oxygen for our souls and spirits.

How do you do family devotions with your children? I know that young families are busy with various activities and that there is no perfect family. Every family experiences struggles, and difficult seasons. This means that perfect family devotion doesn't exist either. Even if something doesn't seem to be working in your family, will the devotion really be worth the effort to make it work? The answer is a big YES! There is so much value in gathering around the table with the common goal of discussing God's word. The result may not come immediately or soon. Even if you think they aren't listening, the effort you put into family devotion will not be wasted. And there are spiritual benefits as we learn from each other. Good conversation about God's word is beneficial for each family member, even for a little child.

The strategy for easy family devotion is to start small and keep it simple. Make the time appropriate for the various ages of your kids, the lifestyle you live, the time you have available, and the spiritual maturity of your family. You can start with 10 minutes.

The Bible plays a central role during family devotions. I have heard great things about The Big Picture Story Bible from Crossway books for children. I found that people I respect highly admire it. It covers the entire range of Scripture and is grounded in sound theology. If you encourage little children to read a verse or two, sing a song together, listen to them respectfully and lovingly whatever they say, and conclude with a brief prayer, then it will be wonderful! That's it. Even if the devotion doesn't happen, that's okay. Just make sure you are opening the Bible daily.

If you have teenage children and have never done family devotions before, don't expect them to immediately understand the purpose or see the benefits of deep discussions or answers. Instead, focus on progress. Aim to improve a little each time and celebrate small victories. Each individual must choose to follow Christ on their own. Children must feel motivated to make that choice for themselves, and this can be challenging if they see God as something their parents impose on them. If you could continue to pray for children patiently, I am sure that God will make a chance for them to come to the Lord. Help them develop a personal relationship with God as a guide, teacher, and encourager.

For a simple format, consider

- Inviting the Holy Spirit
- Reading and discussing what God is teaching through the Bible
- Singing a song a cappella
- Praying together for the day

If you live without children, it may be a little easier to gather around the Word of God to share thoughts, concerns, and life issues. The Upper Room or Our Daily Bread could be a good helpful resource.

A life rooted in the joy of God will provide our children with life-giving nourishment and a solid foundation for the future. Along with prayers filled with love for their lives, introducing them to the presence of God will be an eternal gift for the next generation.

## Shop with scrip...support your church



In 2019, the Administrative Council brainstormed ideas to help the churches finances. One of the ideas that came out of the brainstorming was to start a Scrip program at Sparta UMC. There are still so many in our congregation that doesn't understand how this program works. Each month I place

an order for Scrip (gift) cards.

This program doesn't cost any additional money in your monthly or weekly budget. Here is an example of how this program works. If your weekly or monthly budget for groceries, gas, and health & beauty aids is \$300; if you purchase a \$100 Hansen's card, \$100 Kwik Trip card and \$100 Walmart card the church gets a percentage of the cost of the card costing you nothing. You pay \$100 for a Hansen's card, the church receives 5%; \$100 Kwik Trip card the church receives 4%; and \$100 Walmart card the church receives 2.5%.

 $$100 \times 5\% = $5$  $$100 \times 4\% = $4$  $$100 \times 2.5\% = $2$ 

 $100 \times 2.5\% = 2.5$ 

With your \$300 purchase of the above cards the church receives \$11.50 and it doesn't cost you any more in your weekly or monthly household budget. Most of our businesses offer denominations of \$25, \$50 or \$100 cards. We currently have 36 businesses that you can purchase cards for. There are many more businesses that participate but we can't list everything. If you are wondering if a particular business is part of the Raise Right Scrip program contact me (Cheryl Isensee) and I can look at the larger list. I would like to thank everyone that has used this program. When I put the monthly order in I usually order extra cards that are available until the next order is submitted.

One happy Scrip card customer says, "I am so happy for this program, I wish I would have started doing it much sooner. I don't worry about carrying cash around or having to write a check when I go to the store, I just get my Scrip card and make the purchase and the church makes money from something that I would normally be purchasing anyway. I highly recommend the Scrip program to others".




